Notice is hereby given that the Ochoco Irrigation Company, duly incorporated under the laws of the State of Oregon, intends to construct an irrigating ditch and to divert the waters of Bear Creek in Crook County, Oregon, from their natural channel into said ditch to the amount of nine hundred inches, miner's measurement, under a six inch pressure, which ditch is to be four feet wide at the bottom and 20 inches deep, and is to commence on the north side of Bear Creek in the south west quarter of section 33, in township 17 South, of range 17 east, of Willamette Meridian, thence running in a northwesterly direction and terminating in the south east quarter of the south west quarter of section 30, in township 17, South, of range 17 east, of Willamette Meridian.

Notice is hereby given, that the undersigned from this day located an irrigation ditch to be known as the Squaw Creek Irrigation Ditch, that the said company intends to divert from said Squaw Creek for irrigation purposes at or near the point marked on plan hereto annexed and marked Exhibit A, south east fourth of section twenty nine, in Twp. 15 S. R. 11 E. 10 M. in Grant County, Oregon, the said ditch to be run and built in a north westerly direction or course from the point of diversion from said Squaw Creek, and run in general course as marked on plan hereto annexed and marked Exhibit A, and terminating at a point as marked on plan, Exhibit A at or near NE corner of Twp. 15 S. R. 11 E., that said ditch, canal or flume is intended to be of the following depth, width and capacity, to-wit: 16 feet wide at the bottom and 6 feet deep, and is intended to carry Ten (10) thousand inches of water under a six inch pressure, Miner's Measurement, and the said owner, corporation intend to appropriate such quantity of water for irrigation, domestic, horse hold and any general purposes
